Pastor's Corner

As I'm writing this article, I realize it's Earth Day! This reminded me of an issue of *National Geographic* I once read that was entirely dedicated to water as one of our basic natural resources. They raise some compelling questions: "The amount of water on Earth has not changed. The water the dinosaurs drank millions of years ago is the same water that falls as rain today. But will there be enough for a more crowded world?"



I'm willing to bet that most all of us have asked ourselves that question in the past, having come through the worst pandemic in a generation and other family struggles known only to you. Will there be enough? Enough water for all? Enough food for all? Enough money to retire on?





**From the Heritage Committee
Mother-Daughter Banquets and Teas
1955-1999**

Banquets sponsored by WELCA and honoring Mothers, Daughters and Graduating Seniors began in 1955, changed to Teas in 1973 and returned to Banquets in 1983 until they were discontinued after 1999. Attendance was as high as 193 in 1982 and 180 in 1989. If a mother had more than one daughter, the extra daughter might fill in as someone else's daughter for the day.

Food was prepared by the ladies. The 1955 menu included meatballs, scalloped potatoes, string beans, jello salad, rolls, butter, celery and radishes and a strawberry dessert. A salad buffet was served at the 1999 banquet along with a strawberry shortcake dessert. The song, *Waiters, Waiters* (sung to the tune of *Ruben, Ruben*), was sung by all as a thank you to the men who helped with serving and cleanup.

*Waiters, waiters we've been thinking
How efficient you have been;
Thank you for serving at our banquet
Maybe next year you'll do it again!*




